## NMCZ Announces Result with 54% pass rate

The Nursing and Midwifery Council of Zambia (NMCZ) has released the latest examination results, with 10,861 candidates sitting for exams and 5,868 passing giving an overall pass rate of 54 percent. Among Registered Nurses, the pass rate was 47 percent, while Midwifery achieved 67 percent, Public Health Nursing 60 percent, and Mental Health Nursing 50 percent. Advanced diploma programmes saw standout results, including Critical Care Nursing and Clinical Instructor programmes with 100 percent pass rates.

The results highlight the growing strength of Zambia's healthcare workforce. Madam Beauty Zimba, CEO of NMCZ, credited strong leadership, modern training methods, and collaboration with institutions for the improvements in professional standards. Nursing and midwifery schools across the country have modernized teaching, introduced specialized courses, and embraced digital learning, producing graduates ready to meet Zambia's evolving healthcare needs.

### **Profile: Professor Lonia Mwape – A Nurse Who Became a professor**

Professor Lonia Mwape, Dean of the School of Nursing Sciences at the University of Zambia, is a distinguished academic and one of Zambia's most respected figures in mental health nursing. Born and raised in Twapya Township, Ndola, her journey from humble beginnings to professorship is a story of determination, resilience, and purpose. Her early education at Mabungo and Kashitu Primary Schools, followed by secondary studies at Mabel Shaw Girls in Mbereshi, shaped her independence and discipline — traits that would define her career.

Initially aspiring to become a fashion designer, Professor Mwape's path took a transformative turn when she enrolled at the Lusaka School of Nursing, later specializing in mental health nursing at Chainama College of Health Sciences. It was there that her passion for teaching and mental health advocacy took root. Despite societal stigma toward mental illness, she embraced the field with courage, determined to challenge misconceptions and elevate its professional standing. With the support of the Ministry of Health, Professor Mwape pursued further studies abroad, earning a Bachelor's, Master's (with distinction), and later a PhD from Glasgow Caledonian University and Leeds Beckett University in the United Kingdom. Her international training not only deepened her expertise but also positioned her as a pioneer in advancing mental health education in Zambia. Today, Professor Mwape stands as a role model and mentor to countless young nurses.

Beyond her impressive qualifications PhD, MSc, BSc, RMN, and RN she is guided by humility and a strong sense of service. “Nursing is not about chasing a big salary,” she says. “It's about serving others.” Through her leadership, scholarship, and advocacy, Professor Mwape continues to shape the future of nursing and mental health care in Zambia and beyond.
